2 Kings 15

Verses 1 -7

In the twenty-seventh year of Jeroboam king of Israel, Azariah son of Amaziah king of Judah became king. ² He was sixteen years old when he became king, and he reigned for fifty-two years in Jerusalem; and his mother's name was Jecoliah of Jerusalem. ³ He did what was right in the sight of the Lord, in accordance with everything that his father Amaziah had done. ⁴ Only the high places were not eliminated; the people still sacrificed and burned incense on the high places. ⁵ And the Lord afflicted the king, so that he had leprosy to the day of his death. And he lived in a separate house, while Jotham the king's son was in charge of the household, judging the people of the land. ⁶ Now *as for* the rest of the acts of Azariah and all that he did, are they not written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Judah? ⁷ And Azariah lay down with his fathers, and they buried him with his fathers in the city of David, and his son Jotham became king in his place.

In the twenty-seventh year of Jeroboam king of Israel, <u>Azariah son of Amaziah</u> <u>king of Judah became king</u>. ² He was sixteen years old when he became king, and he reigned for fifty-two years in Jerusalem; and his mother's name was Jecoliah of Jerusalem.

God afflict him with leprosy because he attempted to burn incense in the house of the Lord.

¹⁶ But when he became strong, his heart was so proud that he acted corruptly, and he was untrue to the Lord his God, for he entered the temple of the Lord to burn incense on the altar of incense.

We know when this happened in 750 BC because his son Jotham sat on his father's throne for the last 10 years of Uzziah's reign while he had leprosy.

This is the clearest evidence we have that a king had a co-reign with his father. We know there were other kings that had a co-reign but the evidence is much more subtle and it takes a lot of pain stacking analysis of the various kings and what year they began and ended their reigns in relation to the other kings.

⁶ Now *as for* the rest of the acts of Azariah and all that he did, are they not written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Judah?

His acts are recorded in 2 Chronicles 26:6 -15 and are summarized in the chart below.

Acts of Uzziah

- 1 Now he went out and fought against the Philistines, and broke down the wall of Gath, and Ashdod; and he built cities among the Philistines.
- 2 The Ammonites gave tribute to Uzziah, and his fame extended to the border of Egypt

3 Uzziah built towers in Jerusalem at the Corner Gate, the Valley Gate, and he fortified them.

4 Uzziah had an army of 307,500, who could wage war with great power

5 Uzziah prepared for all the army shields, spears, helmets, and body armor

6 In Jerusalem he made machines of war for the purpose of shooting arrows and great stones

Verses 8 - 12

⁸ In the thirty-eighth year of Azariah king of Judah, Zechariah the son of Jeroboam became king over Israel in Samaria for six months. ⁹ He did evil in the sight of the Lord, just as his fathers had done; he did not desist from the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, into which he misled Israel. ¹⁰ Then Shallum the son of Jabesh conspired against him, and struck him in the presence of the people and killed him, and reigned in his place. ¹¹ Now *as for* the rest of the acts of Zechariah, behold they are written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Israel. ¹² This is the word of the Lord which He spoke to Jehu, saying, "Your sons *to* the fourth *generation* shall sit on the throne of Israel." And so it was.

⁸ In the thirty-eighth year of Azariah king of Judah, <u>Zechariah the son of Jeroboam</u> <u>became king over Israel in Samaria for six months.</u>

¹⁰ Then Shallum the son of Jabesh conspired against him, and struck him in the presence of the people and killed him, and reigned in his place.

The overthrow of Zechariah fulfilled the prophecy given by Hosea.

⁴ And the Lord said to him, "Name him Jezreel; for in just a little while <u>I will punish</u> <u>the house of Jehu for the bloodshed of Jezreel</u>, and I will put an end to the kingdom of the house of Israel.

The rulers of Jezreel beheaded King Ahab's 70 sons at Jezreel and brought their heads to Jehu at his "request". Jehu was responsible for this massacre.

¹² This is the word of the Lord which He spoke to Jehu, saying, "Your sons *to* the fourth *generation* shall sit on the throne of Israel." And so it was.

Zachariah will be the last king in the Jehu dynasty and the fulfillment of this prophesy.

This dynasty started with Jehu in 841 BC and will end with Zechariah in 752 BC, covering a period of 89 years.

Verses 13 -16

¹³ Shallum the son of Jabesh became king in the thirty-ninth year of Uzziah king of Judah, and he reigned for one month in Samaria. ¹⁴ Then Menahem the son of Gadi went up from Tirzah and came to Samaria, and struck Shallum son of Jabesh in Samaria, and killed him and became king in his place. ¹⁵ Now *as for* the rest of the acts of Shallum and his conspiracy which he formed, behold, they are written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Israel. ¹⁶ Then Menahem attacked Tiphsah and all who were in it and its borders from Tirzah, because they did not open up *to him*; so he attacked *it* and ripped up all its women who were pregnant.

¹³ <u>Shallum the son of Jabesh</u> became king in the thirty-ninth year of Uzziah king of Judah, and he reigned for one month in Samaria.





The Northern kingdom began at the black line (just an approximation because the border was uneven) and extended to the Euphrates River. When Menahem took the throne the town of Tiphsah rejected his rule and he acted swiftly and violently to end their opposition. However, the killing of the pregnant woman is inexplicable and we know that this kind of action will not go unpunished.

Verses 17 -22

¹⁷ In the thirty-ninth year of Azariah king of Judah, Menahem the son of Gadi became king over Israel *and reigned* for ten years in Samaria. ¹⁸ He did evil in the sight of the Lord; for all his days he did not desist from the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, into which he misled Israel. ¹⁹ Pul, the king of Assyria, came against the land, and Menahem gave Pul a thousand talents of silver so that his hand might be with him to strengthen the kingdom under his rule. ²⁰ Then Menahem collected the money from Israel, from all the mighty men of wealth, from each man fifty shekels of silver to pay the king of Assyria. So the king of Assyria returned and did not stay there in the land. ²¹ Now *as for* the rest of the acts of Menahem and all that he did, are they not written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Israel? ²² And Menahem lay down with his fathers, and his son Pekahiah became king in his place.

¹⁹ Pul, the king of Assyria, came against the land, and Menahem gave Pul <u>1000</u> <u>talents</u> of silver

Pul is better known as Tiglath-pileser

The king had to collect 1000 talents of silver as tribute to pay off the King of Assyria.

A talent of silver contained 3000 shekels so he needed 3,000,000 shekels.

²⁰ Then Menahem collected the money from Israel, <u>from all the mighty men of</u> <u>wealth</u>, <u>from each man fifty shekels</u> of silver to pay the king of Assyria. So the king of Assyria returned and did not stay there in the land.

3,000,000 shekels / 50 shekels per man = 60,000 men.

The king took this money from "the mighty men of wealth". This shows that there was still considerable wealth in the Northern kingdom despite their long history of evil kings and a population that had rejected God. So where exactly did the Jews get the idea that the <u>less fortunate</u> in the land were being punished for their sin as we see in the New Testament?

Even the disciples of Jesus had this mistaken philosophy.

See 1 John 9:1-2

As *Jesus* passed by, He saw a man *who had been* blind from birth. ² And His disciples asked Him, "Rabbi, <u>who sinned</u>, this man or his parents, that he would <u>be born blind?"</u>

Some man-made philosophies die hard and are reinvented in new ways, so if anyone thinks that they are rich because they are morally superior to the less fortunate we can only hope that someone will reach them with the Gospel Message because they have been deceived by the evil one.

Verses 23 - 26

²³ In the fiftieth year of Azariah king of Judah, Pekahiah the son of Menahem became king over Israel in Samaria, *and reigned* for two years. ²⁴ He did evil in the sight of the Lord; he did not desist from the sins of Jeroboam son of Nebat, into which he misled Israel. ²⁵ Then Pekah the son of Remaliah, his officer, conspired against him and struck him in Samaria, in the castle of the king's house with Argob and Arieh; and with him were fifty men of the Gileadites, and he killed him and became king in his place. ²⁶ Now *as for* the rest of the acts of Pekahiah and everything that he did, behold, they are written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Israel.

²³ In the fiftieth year of Azariah king of Judah, Pekahiah the son of Menahem became king over Israel in Samaria, *and reigned* for two years.

Gilead can refer to the half tribe of Manasseh east of the Jordan River or the entire east side (all 3 tribes) depending on its reference.

Verses 27 - 31

²⁷ In the fifty-second year of Azariah king of Judah, Pekah the son of Remaliah became king over Israel in Samaria, *and he reigned* for twenty years. ²⁸ He did evil in the sight of the Lord; he did not desist from the sins of Jeroboam son of Nebat, into which he misled Israel.

²⁹ In the days of Pekah king of Israel, Tiglath-pileser the king of Assyria came and took Ijon, Abel-beth-maacah, Janoah, Kedesh, Hazor, Gilead, and Galilee, all the land of Naphtali; and he led their populations into exile to Assyria. ³⁰ And Hoshea the son of Elah formed a conspiracy against Pekah the son of Remaliah, and struck him and put him to death, and he became king in his place, in the twentieth year of Jotham the son of Uzziah. ³¹ Now *as for* the rest of the acts of Pekah and all that he did, behold, they are written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Israel.

²⁷ In the fifty-second year of Azariah king of Judah, <u>Pekah the son of Remaliah</u> <u>became king over Israel in Samaria</u>, *and he reigned* for twenty years.







He built the upper gate of the house of the Lord. ³⁶ Now *as for* the rest of the acts of Jotham which he did, are they not written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Judah? ³⁷ In those days the Lord began to send Rezin the king of Aram and Pekah the son of Remaliah against Judah. ³⁸ And Jotham lay down with his fathers, and he was buried with his fathers in the city of his father David; and his son Ahaz became king in his place.




