
Genesis 11

Verse 1-2

Now all the earth used the <u>same language</u> and the same words. ² And it came about, as they journeyed east, that they found <u>a plain in the land of Shinar</u> and settled there.

The sons of Noah started out near <u>Mount Ararat</u> but as the population grew they spread out to <u>the land of Shinar</u>

This is the plain on which Nimrod built Nineveh, Babylon and other cities

See Genesis 10:8-12

All the people were descendants of Noah and lived in the same region so the language remained the same

Verse 3-4

³ Then they said to one another, "Come, let's make bricks and fire *them* thoroughly." And they used brick for stone, and they used tar for mortar. ⁴ And they said, "Come, let's build ourselves a city, <u>and a tower</u> whose top *will reach* into heaven, and let's make a name for ourselves; <u>otherwise we will be scattered</u> <u>abroad over the face of all the earth</u>."

Let's build ourselves a city, and a tower whose top will reach into heaven

The Babylonians called such a tower a ziggurat

An immense tower shaped like a pyramid rising in terraces and crowned with a temple

Lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth

God had commanded Noah to multiply and replenish the earth

But Noah's ancestors wanted to stay in one area

Verse 5-6

⁵ Now the Lord came down to see the city and the tower which the men had built. ⁶ And the Lord said, "Behold, they are one people, and they all have the same language. And this is what they have started to do, and <u>now nothing which they</u> <u>plan to do will be impossible for them</u>.

God intervened at the time of Noah because all of mankind was evil continually

Life on earth had become <u>unbearable</u>, and the only solution was a complete reset

In this case, the problem was less dramatic, but if God had not intervened this would have become a huge problem over time.

So God intervened once more to help mankind in the long run

Verse 7 – 9

<u>Come, let Us go down and there confuse their language</u>, so that they will not understand one another's speech." ⁸ So the Lord scattered them abroad from there over the face of all the earth; and they stopped building the city. ⁹ Therefore it was named Babel, because there the Lord confused the language of all the earth; and from there the Lord scattered them abroad over the face of all the earth.

Come, let Us go down and there confuse their language

By confusing their speech, God insured their separation

We know this because in Genesis 10:25 it says,

²⁵ Two sons were born to Eber; the name of the one *was* <u>Peleg, for in his days the earth</u> <u>was divided</u>; and his brother's name *was* Joktan.

If one was to follow the dates given in modern translations, there would only be 100 years between the flood and the Tower of Babel.

Using that time frame, the population would not be large enough to build the tower.

This is another reason why the dates in the Septuagint should be used.

Verses 10 - 26

¹⁰ <u>These are *the records of* the generations of Shem</u>. Shem was a hundred years old when he fathered Arpachshad, two years after the flood; ¹¹ and Shem lived five hundred years after he fathered Arpachshad, and he fathered *other* sons and daughters.

¹² Arpachshad lived thirty-five years, and fathered Shelah; ¹³ and Arpachshad lived 403 years after he fathered Shelah, and he fathered *other* sons and daughters.

¹⁴ Shelah lived thirty years, and fathered Eber; ¹⁵ and Shelah lived 403 years after he fathered Eber, and he fathered *other* sons and daughters.

¹⁶ Eber lived thirty-four years, and fathered Peleg; ¹⁷ and Eber lived 430 years after he fathered Peleg, and he fathered *other* sons and daughters.

¹⁸ Peleg lived thirty years, and fathered Reu; ¹⁹ and Peleg lived 209 years after he fathered Reu, and he fathered *other* sons and daughters.

²⁰ Reu lived thirty-two years, and fathered Serug; ²¹ and Reu lived 207 years after he fathered Serug, and he fathered *other* sons and daughters.

²² Serug lived thirty years, and fathered Nahor; ²³ and Serug lived two hundred years after he fathered Nahor, and he fathered *other* sons and daughters.

²⁴ Nahor lived twenty-nine years, and fathered Terah; ²⁵ and Nahor lived 119 years after he fathered Terah, and he fathered *other* sons and daughters.

²⁶ Terah lived seventy years, and fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran.

Verses 27- 32


²⁷ Now these are the records of the generations of Terah. Terah fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran fathered Lot. ²⁸ Haran died during the lifetime of his father Terah in the land of his birth, in Ur of the Chaldeans. ²⁹ Abram and Nahor took wives for themselves. The name of Abram's wife was Sarai, and the name of Nahor's wife was Milcah, the daughter of Haran, the father of Milcah and Iscah.

Now these are the records of the generations of Terah

Here is the Hebrew word for generations again. This is the 6th section

Terah fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran fathered Lot.

Up to this point, just a few major events in the life of mankind have been told

The creation of Adam & Eve in chapters 1 & 2

The fall of Adam and Eve in chapter 3

The global flood in chapters 6 thru 8

The Tower of Babel here in chapter 11

The first <u>11 chapters</u> of Genesis span a period of about <u>3,200 years</u>

Genesis 12 to the end of the O.T., 918 chapters, covers about 1600 years

As we can see, the relationship with Israel took a lot of ink to explain



Verses 30-32

³⁰ Sarai was unable to conceive; she did not have a child. ³¹ Now Terah took his son Abram, and Lot the son of Haran, his grandson, and his daughter-in-law Sarai, his son Abram's wife, and they departed together from Ur of the Chaldeans to go to the land of Canaan; and they went as far as Haran and settled there. ³² The days of Terah were 205 years; and Terah died in Haran.

If Terah and his family could have traveled west thru the desert It would have been a much shorter trip (about half the distance) Instead they had to take the established route along the Fertile Crescent

³² The days of Terah were 205 years; and Terah died in Haran.

Terah died at age 205

And Abraham was 75 when he left Haran

So Terah was 130 years old when Abraham was born.
